



1. Mickey's Magic Word Match

Objective: Help kids get to know each other by finding their "Mickey Match" using magic words.

Setup: Prepare pairs of Mickey Mouse-themed cards with simple, matching "magic words" written on them (e.g., "Hot" on one card and "Dog" on another, "Mickey" on one and "Mouse" on another). Ensure there's a card for each child.

How to Play: As the children arrive, give each one a card. Once everyone has a card, explain that they need to find the person with the card that matches theirs to form a complete word or phrase. For example, the child with "Hot" must find the child with "Dog." Once they find their match, they introduce themselves and say their favorite Mickey Mouse character. This game encourages mingling and introduces the kids to one another in a fun way.

2. Mickey's Hot Dog Toss

Objective: Gain points by tossing "hot dogs" into Mickey Mouse-themed targets.

Setup: Create targets using large cardboard cutouts of Mickey's face with open mouths, or use buckets decorated with Mickey stickers. Prepare soft toy hot dogs (or beanbags).

How to Play: Set up the targets at different distances. Each child takes turns tossing the hot dogs into the targets. Award points based on the difficulty of the target. The child with the most points at the end wins a small prize.



3. Goofy's Bubble Blast

Objective: Have fun popping as many bubbles as possible within a set time.

Setup: Use a bubble machine or blow bubbles manually. Ensure you have enough space for the kids to run around safely.

How to Play: Start the bubble machine and let the kids chase and pop the bubbles. You can make it more exciting by adding challenges like "Pop only the big bubbles" or "See who can pop the most bubbles in 30 seconds." The goal is simply to have fun while being active.

4. Pluto's Balloon Poppers

Objective: Help Pluto pop the balloons to find hidden surprises.

Setup: Inflate balloons and place small toys or notes with surprises inside some of them. Use Mickey Mouse-themed stickers or tape to close the balloons.

How to Play: Kids take turns popping a balloon by sitting on it or using a blunt object (like a small wooden spoon). If they find a surprise inside, they get to keep it! If not, they try again in the next round. Continue until all surprises are found.

5. Mickey's Roadster Race

Objective: Enjoy a high-energy race with a Mickey Mouse-themed twist.

Setup: Set up a racecourse using cones or tape to create lanes. Provide ride-on cars, tricycles, or scooters, and decorate them with Mickey Mouse-themed decals.

How to Play: Divide the children into two or more teams. Each child must race their "Mickey's Roadster" from the start line to the finish line and back, tagging the next teammate to start their leg of the race. The first team to have all players finish wins the race.

6. Mickey's Magical Color Hunt

Objective: Engage kids in a color-based scavenger hunt around the party area.

Setup: Hide colored cards or small objects around the party area, each with an image of Mickey or his friends. Assign each child a color to find.

How to Play: Each child must search for and collect all the objects or cards of their assigned color. Once they've collected all their items, they can trade them in for a small prize. To make it more challenging, give hints or create a treasure map!



7. Pluto's Fetch Challenge

Objective: Work together in teams to collect as many "bones" as possible in a relay-style game.

Setup: Scatter soft toy bones or bone-shaped cutouts around the play area. Divide the children into two or more teams. Provide each team with a small bucket or bag.

How to Play: Each child in the team takes turns running out to collect a bone and bring it back to the team's bucket before the next player can go. The team that collects the most bones within the time limit wins.

8. Mickey's Hoop Hop

Objective: Hop through a series of hoops to reach the finish line as fast as possible.

Setup: Lay out a series of hula hoops on the ground, spaced a few feet apart. Decorate the hoops with Mickey Mouse-themed stickers or colors.

How to Play: The children must hop from one hoop to the next without stepping outside the hoops. The game can be played as a race, where the first child to reach the finish line wins, or as a timed challenge where each child tries to complete the course as quickly as possible.

9. Minnie's Parachute Pop

Objective: Keep the balloon floating in the air as a team using a parachute.

Setup: Use a large parachute or bed sheet. Inflate a large balloon decorated with Mickey and Minnie Mouse stickers.

How to Play: Gather the children around the parachute, holding the edges. Place the balloon in the center, and the goal is to work together to keep the balloon floating by bouncing it up with the parachute. You can add extra balloons for more excitement or introduce challenges like bouncing the balloon to a certain height.



10. Mickey's Whisker Run

Objective: Navigate through a racecourse while balancing a whisker on your face.

Setup: Create a simple racecourse using cones, ropes, or chalk. Prepare soft whiskers (use strips of yarn or pipe cleaners) attached to small headbands or clips.

How to Play: The children must balance the whiskers on their faces (without holding them) as they run through the racecourse. If the whisker falls, they must stop and put it back on before continuing. The first child to finish the course with the whisker still on wins.

11. Mickey Mouse Trivia Time

Objective: Calm the kids down by testing their knowledge of Mickey Mouse and his friends with fun and simple trivia questions.

Setup: Prepare a list of easy, preschool-friendly trivia questions about Mickey Mouse, his friends, and their adventures. You can use simple questions like "What color are Mickey's shoes?" or "Who is Mickey's best friend?" Create a cozy, quiet area with soft cushions or blankets where the children can sit comfortably.

How to Play: Gather the children in the cozy area and explain that it's trivia time! Ask each child a Mickey Mouse trivia question in turn. If they answer correctly, they get a small sticker or token. If they need help, the other children can assist them, encouraging teamwork and gentle interaction. Continue until all the questions are answered or until everyone has had a turn. This game is designed to be calm and relaxing, allowing the children to focus and wind down after more active play.
